Food Insecurity

The number of people in our region going hungry is continuing to rise. As cost-of-living pressures remain, so too will food insecurity which is impacting 123,000 people in our region.

Despite all the challenges, our goal remains clear. No one in our community should have to go hungry. Building hope for the future starts with ensuring everyone has access to nutritious food, dignity, and the support they need to thrive.

What We Do

Each year, **750,000 kilograms** of food is collected by FoodShare. This equates to **one million meals**, which is distributed to **123,000 people experiencing food insecurity** in our region.

Providing food to over **120 agencies, community centres and schools**, FoodShare distributes food supplies across a 150km radius of Albury-Wodonga.

This vital work is made possible by an award winning team of over **250 highly motivated volunteers**, who collectively contribute to over **31,000 hours** of service each year.

FoodShare is more than a food relief agency.

It is part of the vital social infrastructure of the region that **brings together food security, health, community support, and educational benefits** to those in need.



Community Pantry

In 2021, FoodShare introduced a **Community Pantry** initiative to offer a flexible and empowering approach to food security.

The social supermarket and hamper service supports individuals and families **struggling to put food on the table** by offering stability and choice through access to fresh food and pantry staples.

Over **600 families** are supported each month with access to **nutritious groceries, household essentials, and culturally appropriate food options**, helping to reduce food insecurity and promote dignity.

Our Programs

Community Garden

In partnership with Wodonga TAFE, FoodShare's community garden grows fresh produce to provide nutritious food for people in need while creating a communal space for learning, collaboration, and connection.

This initiative supports long-term food security by combining hands-on education with practical food production.

Food Preservation

Volunteer-led food preservation programs extend the life of food supplies, reduce waste, and provide additional options for individuals and families in need.

Landfill Diversion

Waste partnerships help divert non-edible food from landfill, allowing it to be repurposed through worm farms, livestock feed and other recycling initiatives. These opportunities enhance FoodShare's capacity to rescue and recycle larger volumes of food that would otherwise be sent to landfill, creating an even more impactful and positive outcome for the environment.

Disaster Relief

FoodShare plays a vital role in supporting communities before, during and after emergencies. Working closely with local councils, emergency services and community organisations, FoodShare provides critical infrastructure, logistics and food supplies needed to respond rapidly to bushfires, floods and other disasters.

By maintaining strong regional partnerships and a reliable food distribution network, FoodShare helps ensure affected individuals, families and emergency responders have timely access to nutritious food and essential supplies throughout every stage of disaster responses and into recovery.





Funding Opportunities

FoodShare operates with limited Government grants, and relies on the support of our business community, philanthropy and community fundraising to cover essential operating costs.

Money For Jam

Event Sponsorship

The Border Easter Egg Hunt is FoodShare's flagship annual fundraising event and one of the region's most anticipated family celebrations.

A much-loved community celebration attracts more than 2,000 attendees annually, with over 700 children taking part in the Easter Egg Hunt.

Established in 2018, the event has become a cherished fixture on the regional calendar, bringing families together while raising vital funds to support local community programs.

Since FoodShare took ownership of the event in 2024, the Border Easter Egg Hunt has continued to grow in both participation and impact which has raised over \$69,000 to support locals experiencing food insecurity.

Beyond fundraising, the Border Easter Egg Hunt strengthens community connections, celebrates the generosity of local businesses, sponsors and volunteers, and raises awareness of FoodShare's mission to ensure no one in our region goes hungry.

FoodShare Appeals

Each year, FoodShare runs two major community fundraising appeals, encouraging local individuals, businesses and community groups to help provide nutritious food for people experiencing food insecurity across the region.

Donations are tax-deductible and play a vital role in responding to increasing demand.

In conjunction with these appeals, FoodShare hosts Drive-thru food drives on the first Saturday of June and December. Community members are encouraged to fill a box with essential pantry items and deliver it to FoodShare's Community Pantry, providing immediate support to local individuals and families facing hardship.

Together, these appeals strengthen community participation, increase awareness of food insecurity, and ensure FoodShare can continue delivering nutritious food to those who need it most.
